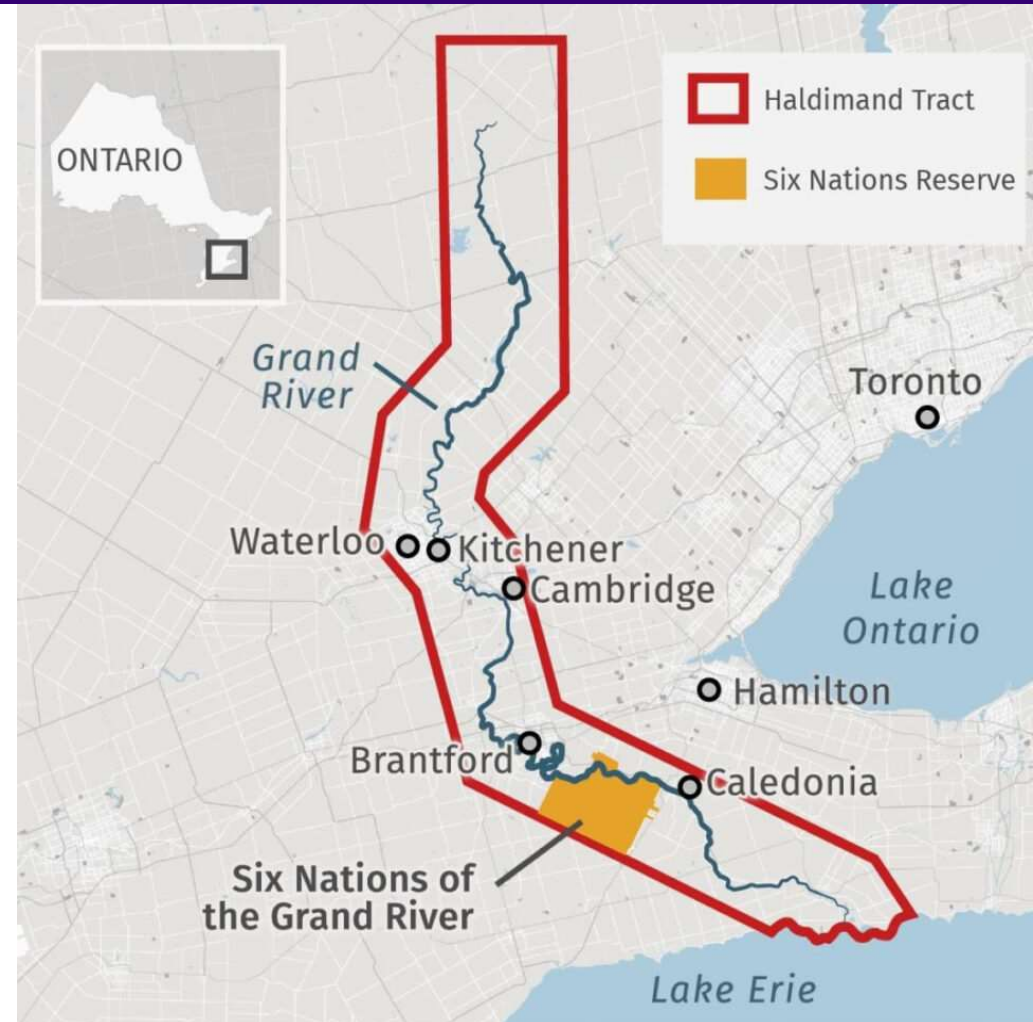
LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We would like to acknowledge that Wilfrid Laurier University and its campuses are located on the shared traditional territory of the Neutral, Anishnaabe (Anish-nah-bay) and Haudenosaunee (Hoe-den-no-show-nee) peoples.

This land is part of the Dish with One Spoon Treaty between the Haudenosaunee and Anishnaabe peoples and symbolizes the agreement to share, protect our resources and not to engage in conflict.

From the Haldimand Proclamation of Oct. 25, 1784, this territory is described as: “six miles deep from each side of the river (Grand River) beginning at Lake Erie and extending in the proportion to the Head of said river, which them and their posterity are to enjoy forever.” the proclamation was signed by the British with their allies, the Six Nations, after the American Revolution.

Despite being the largest reserve demographically in Canada, those nations now reside on less than five percent of this original territory.

The Rhodes Scholarship is a fully funded, full time, postgraduate award which enables talented young people from around the world, to study at the University of Oxford.

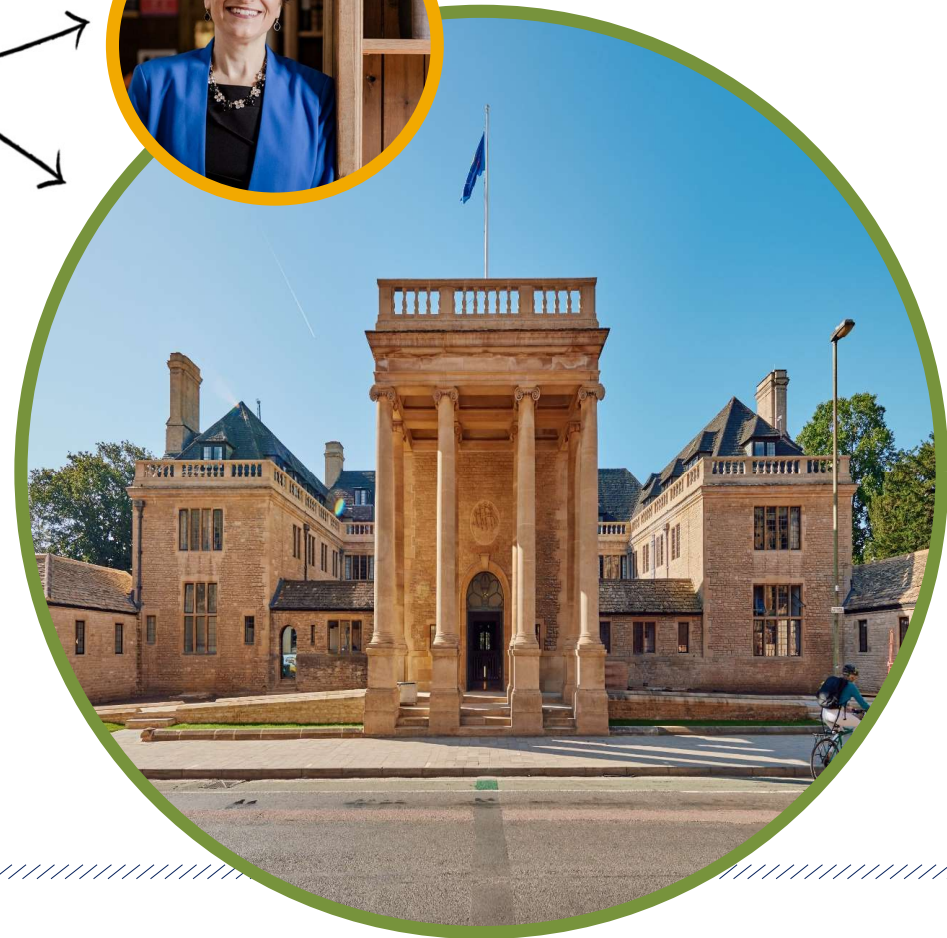
- ✓ Started in **1902** and considered the **oldest** and **most prestigious** scholarship program.
 - ✓ **Exclusive opportunity** to participate in a Rhodes Character, Service & Leadership Program (CSLP)
 - ✓ Applying for the Scholarship is a challenge, but it is an **experience** which has helped generations of young people to **succeed**.

THE RHODES COMMUNITY



Unlike other Oxford University students, you'll have **Rhodes House**, a beautiful building at the heart of the city. It's where the Registrar, the Director of Programming, and the Warden are based.

- Rhodes House hosts **talks, seminars** and **forums** with world **leading experts** and guests.
- There are **study spaces, libraries** and **social events** where you will meet other **Scholars**.
- Scholars also attend social events like the Coming Up Dinner and Rhodes Ball.

- It is expected that Rhodes Scholars to study at Oxford for two years
- Rhodes Scholars may read for **any** full-time postgraduate degree at the University of Oxford, **subject to the few Rhodes requirements and a couple of exceptions**

THE CHARACTER, SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

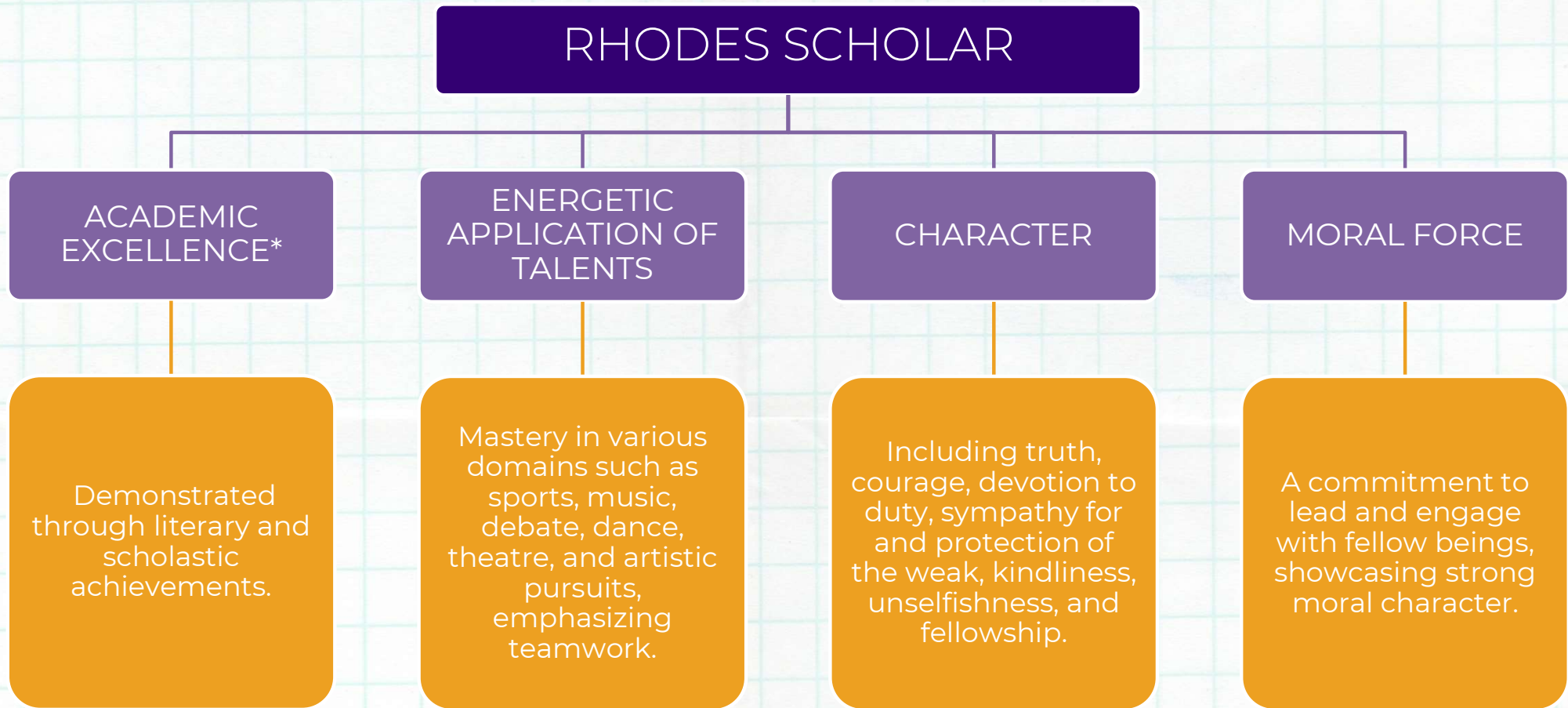


The Character, Service and Leadership Programme (CSLP) support, nurture and facilitate Scholars' lifelong commitment to lead and serve others.

Through Rhodes House-led structured programmatic activities, they equip Scholars with the practical skills and tools to craft a life of impact and passion as individuals and as a collective.



WHO IS A RHODES SCHOLAR?



WHAT DOES THE RHODES SCHOLARSHIP COVER?



- The Rhodes Scholarship covers **Oxford University fees**, as well as providing an **annual stipend**.
- Following selection for the Scholarship, the Rhodes Trust will cover the application fee required to **study** at the University of Oxford.
- The Trust will cover the fee for a **Tier 4 study visa** and the associated **International Health Surcharge (IHS)**.
- Two economy class **flights** - to and from the UK - for the beginning and end of studies in Oxford.
- On arrival in Oxford, Scholars also receive a **settling in allowance**.





The Application

REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY

Citizenship

- Citizen, permanent resident, protected person of Canada.
- Live in Canada.

Age

- Ages **18-23** on 1st October 2025
- OR**
- Under the age of **27** on 1st October 2025
- AND**
- completed your **first** undergraduate degree on or after 1 October 2024*.

Academic Achievement

- Completed an undergraduate degree (usually a Bachelor's) by **July 2026**.
- Academic background and grade that - at a minimum - **meets or exceeds** the specific entry requirements of your chosen course at the University of Oxford.
- Candidates will have a higher chance of successful admission to Oxford if they have **'A' or 83%**.

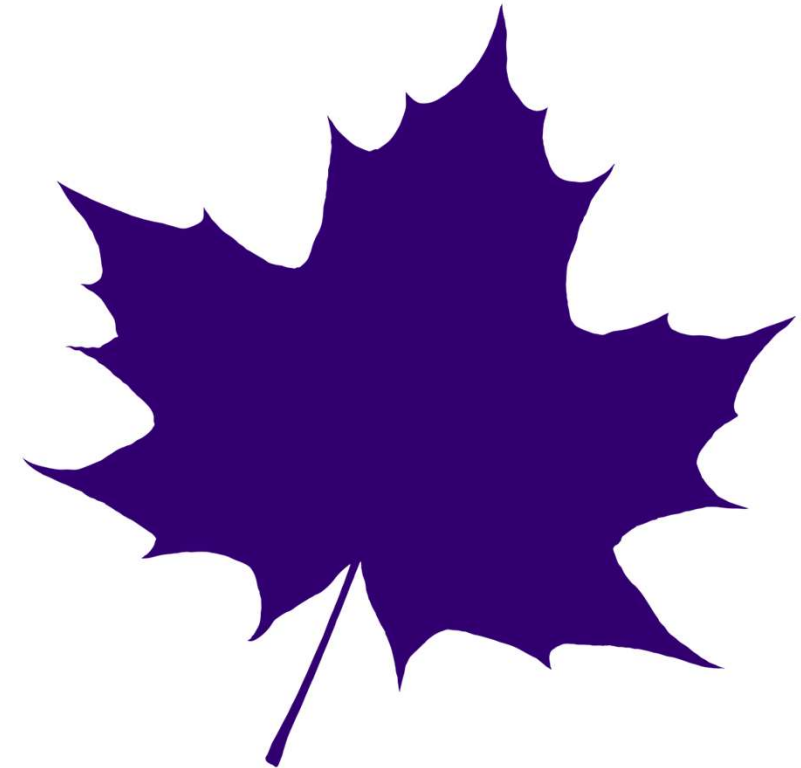

Institutional Endorsement

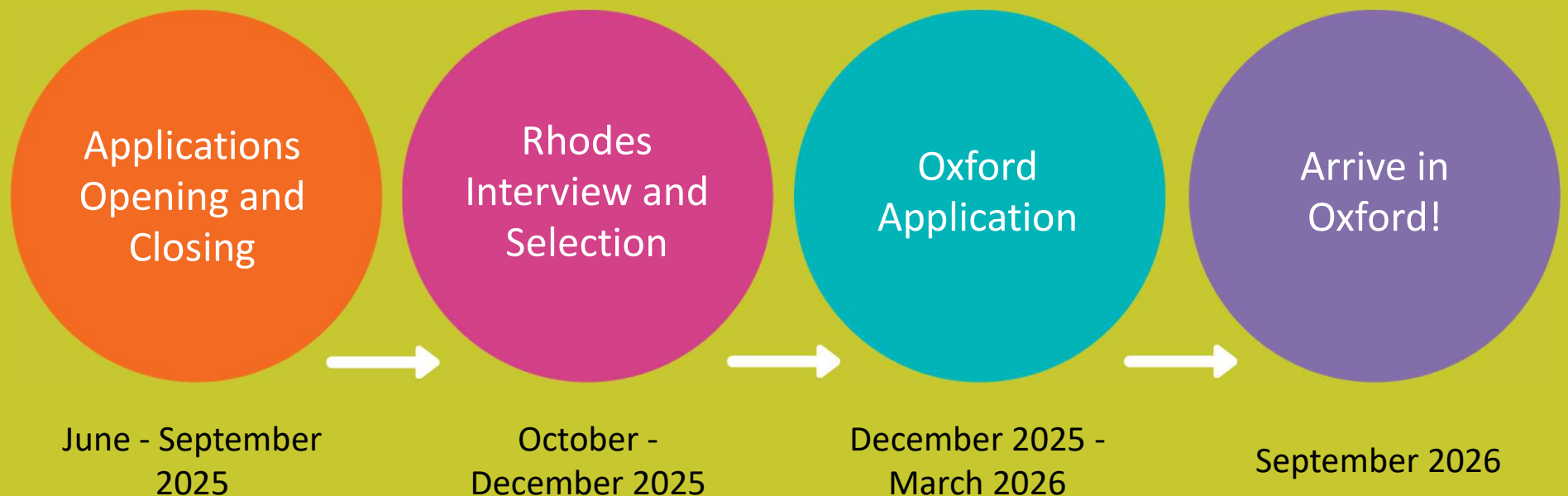
To be eligible to apply for the Rhodes Scholarship, you must receive **official university endorsement** from the institution.

You must complete Laurier's internal application to be considered for Laurier's endorsement of your application for the Rhodes Scholarship Program.

INTERNAL APPLICATION

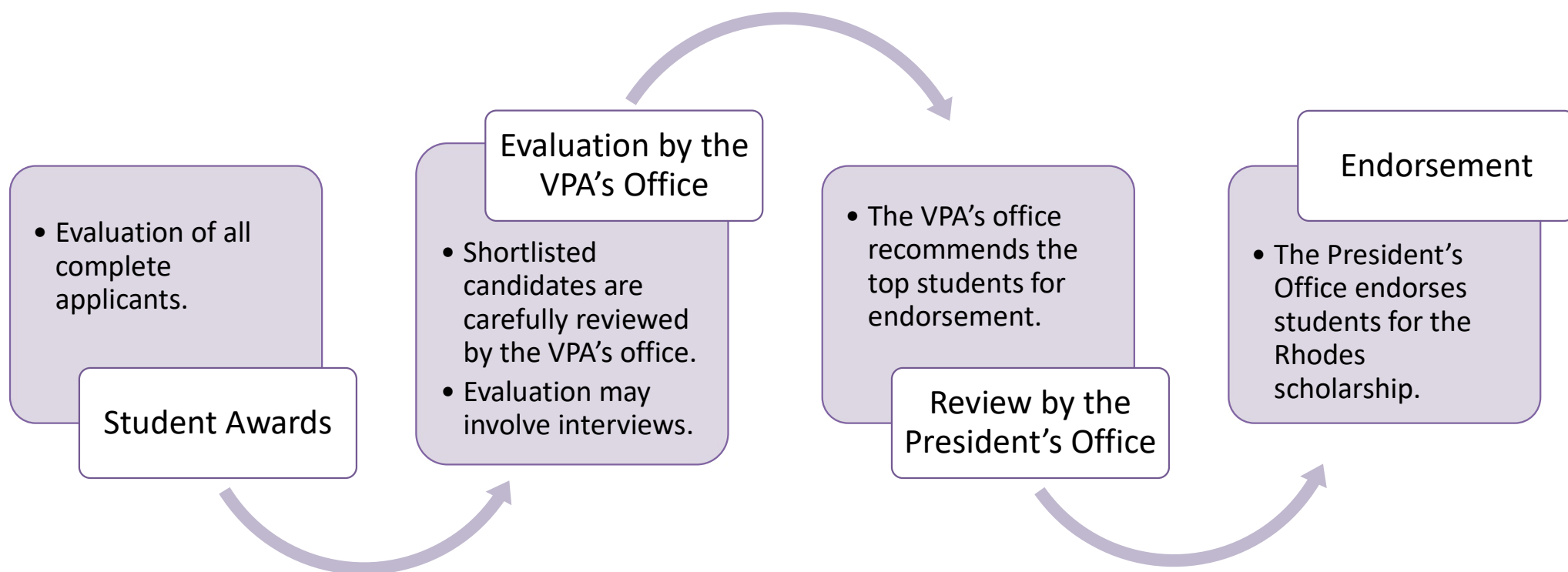
- **Cover page**
 - Name, address, phone number, e-mail address, faculty, program of study, year of study.
- **CV** (*maximum 2 pages, 12 pt. font*)
- **Statement of Interest** (*maximum 1000 words*)
 - Include your proposed course of study.
 - Who you are, what matters to you and what you hope to do in the world.
- **3 Academic References**
 - Faculty members with direct knowledge of your scholastic and other achievements.
- **3 Character References**
 - Direct knowledge of your volunteer and public service duties.
